

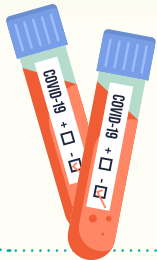

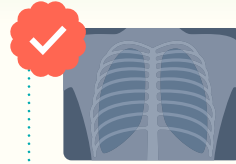
Countries without special travel arrangements

Criteria for foreign patients to seek medical care in Singapore



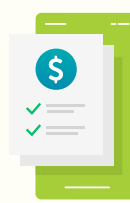
Patient and caregiver must test negative for COVID-19 within 72 hours prior to departure



Patient must not have suspicion of pneumonia on chest imaging performed within 72 hours prior to departure



Attending specialist will submit application to Singapore Ministry of Health (MOH) for travel waiver



Make pre-payment for accommodation at SHN Dedicated Facility (SDF) and associated COVID-19 tests

SG Arrival Card e-service to be completed online at <https://eservices.ica.gov.sg/sgarrivalcard> within 3 days prior to departure

On-arrival requirements and procedures



Hand over all documents to clear immigration checkpoints



Receiving hospital will charter ambulance service to meet and fetch the patient and caregiver from the arrival hall



Patient and caregiver will be admitted directly, followed by 2 PCR swab tests, 24 hours apart

Attending specialist can see and assess patient during admission

Discharge procedure



If both PCR swab tests are negative

Patient and caregiver will be transfer to designated facilities to complete 7 or 14 days stay-home notice period



If either PCR swab tests are positive

Patient and/or caregiver will remain in receiving hospital and managed as COVID-19 patients



Private transportation will be arranged upon discharge
